## *The Problem: Registrations.*

Every week, the same rhythm unfolds. You put together the newsletter—copying over event info that already lives on your website. It's redundant, but necessary, because people still say, "I didn't know that was happening."

Someone RSVPs for Shabbat dinner. Great. You check the registration form... but now you need to manually cross-reference your payment system to see if they paid. For the 10th time this month. And the community seder? A beautiful moment—if only someone would sponsor extra seats. But there's no clear place to invite that generosity.

The office inbox is a mess of emails and texts like:

"Put me down for two."

"Can I come but pay later?"

"Did you get my check?"

The calendar on your website? It's there—but clunky to update, not always current, and not synced with registrations. So you're left with an Excel sheet, hoping the guest list is accurate enough to update the caterer, and that security has a clue who's walking through the door.

Student pricing. Senior pricing. Last-minute cancellations. Sponsorships. Special accommodations. No confirmation emails. **Just you, juggling it all.**

And every time you consider switching to a new system, your stomach turns. You've done this before. You don't want to uproot everything again.

But you also know: this is not sustainable.

## *The Problem: Room Scheduling.*

It starts with a mix-up.

Someone scheduled a Torah Study in the social hall—only to find out the Women’s club already set up for a fundraiser there.

You check your notes, your email, your spreadsheet. No one’s sure how it happened, but now you’re scrambling to move the study—and hoping it won’t happen again.

Meanwhile, you’re fielding messages all week:

“Which room are we in again?”

“Can we book the library every third Tuesday?”

“Has the kitchen been reserved for the luncheon?”

It’s all doable—but exhausting. Every recurring meeting, every updated location, every back-and-forth about which space is available and when... it takes time. And no matter how clearly you try to track it, things still change without warning—someone forgets to loop you in, or a room switch never gets communicated.

Too Much to Manage, Too Important to Lose

Every year, the list grows longer.

Names of loved ones, marked by memory and tradition.
